Trips and Visits

Year 1 trip to the Science Museum

Year 1 had a wide ranging and action packed first visit to the Science Museum. They explored the Space Zone, used their senses in the sensory garden and explored patterns in the pattern pod.

Year 2 trip to the Natural History Museum

Year 2 learnt all about the human body as part of their Super-humans topic. They learnt all about how all of the nerves work to control the human body. They loved seeing how our bodies changed in the funny mirrors and comparing themselves to other species. They also looked at all kinds of animals, from gigantic whales and dinosaurs to tiny bugs that live in our homes! Year 2 all agreed that the moving T.Rex was their favourite!

Year 3 Trip to the National Gallery

Year 3 visited the National Gallery to support their English learning on myths and legends. The children loved spotting characters they knew from Greek myths like Princess Ariadne, Perseus and Medusa in the paintings. They had lots of interesting discussions with their museum teacher during their workshop, shared their learning and even did some acting as soldiers turned to stone by Medusa!

Year 4MG Music Workshops

This workshop focused on expressing emotions through a combination of music and design. Pupils were shown an audio visual presentation of a composer's work and then the children created their own scores and interpreted them with movement and instruments. They finished the day with performances of their compositions.

Year 5 British Museum

Year 5 took part in a fantastic self led activity in which they were gifted I-pads by the Greek goddess Athena and tasked with solving a mystery within the British Museum, home to some of the finest ancient Greek and Roman artefacts in the world.

Year 6 Natural History Museum Year 6 have also visited the Natural History Museum, participating in a workshop measuring the impact of volcanoes as part of their 'What a wonderful world' topic. They also looked at the museum's impressive array of rocks and minerals- plus taking in the almost obligatory visit to the dinosaurs' gallery!

Class Assemblies

5CC celebrated the beginning of our Black History 365 work with a look at some amazing role models both past and present. They also treated us to a memorable performance of the Mary Angelou poem 'Still I Rise.'

6KS Year 6 taught us all about volcanoes and natural disasters. Their assembly was jam packed with fascinating facts and was really brought to life by their newscaster style of delivery!

3RJ showered us with a host of fascinating facts about the ancient Egyptians. The highly detailed instructions, complete with a live demonstration, of the process of mummification was a particular highlight!

Attendance

In It To Win This is our new weekly attendance competition. It is to reinforce the importance of coming to school everyday. The children had their photos taken recently when they dressed up in funny wigs, glasses and hats. These photos will be shown at the celebration assemblies each Friday—on a video loop—which will be stopped randomly.
