


# Curriculum Newsletter

## Nursery

### Autumn 2



Welcome back to Autumn 2 in Nursery!

Our topic this term will be Rhymes and Songs. As part of this topic we will be learning familiar nursery rhymes such as ; 'Incy Wincy Spider ' and 'Old MacDonald'. and also singing songs associated with our theme of the bakery, such as 'Hot Cross Buns', 'Five Currant Buns' and 'I'm a Little Teapot'!

As our first theme is all about baking, we will be role-playing being customers and bakers, exchanging coins for cakes and having a go at some of the key skills needed to bake; such as mixing, pouring, scooping and sieving.

We will also be exploring different flavours and discussing our favourites.

We will explore music through singing, as well as playing instruments and listening to the sounds that they make. We will continue to learn about the rules and routines of nursery and how we keep ourselves and our friends safe.



You can help your child at home by:

- Sharing lots of stories and singing nursery rhymes together – perhaps there are some songs and stories that are special to your family or culture that you can sing together!
- Practicing counting together at home - you can sing counting songs, or count how many steps you take to get to school.
- Playing turn-taking games, and talking about the importance of sharing when playing together and the importance of following the rules.
