In English our class text is ***Ice Palace***.


We will:

- Discuss different opinions and form balanced arguments.
- Predict story events based on character feelings and actions.
- Write letters in role using the first person and past perfect tense.
- Learn to write dialogue using inverted commas.
- Write an adventure story.
- Learn about and write structured poetry.



In Maths we will:

- Identify, represent and estimate numbers in different ways.
- Continue to develop our addition and subtraction skills using numbers with up to three digits.
- Count in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100.
- Solve multiplication and division calculations for numbers with one and two digits using number and times table facts.
- Solve number and practical problems using number facts and place value.
- Develop our reasoning skills.



In Science we will learn about ***Forces and Magnets***.

We will:

- Identify different forces.
- Investigate friction.
- Learn about magnets and magnetic poles.
- Identify magnetic materials.
- Set up simple investigations.
- Make predictions.
- Record our results and draw conclusions.



In Music we will:

- Learn to play the recorder, glockenspiel and Djembe drums.
- Learn about beat, rhythm and tempo.

In RE we will:

- Learn about Christianity.
- Develop our understanding of the worship and festivals of other faiths.

In PE we will:

- Continue our swimming lessons at Brixton Rec.
- Learn co-ordination, balance, ball-control and team work skills in rugby.
